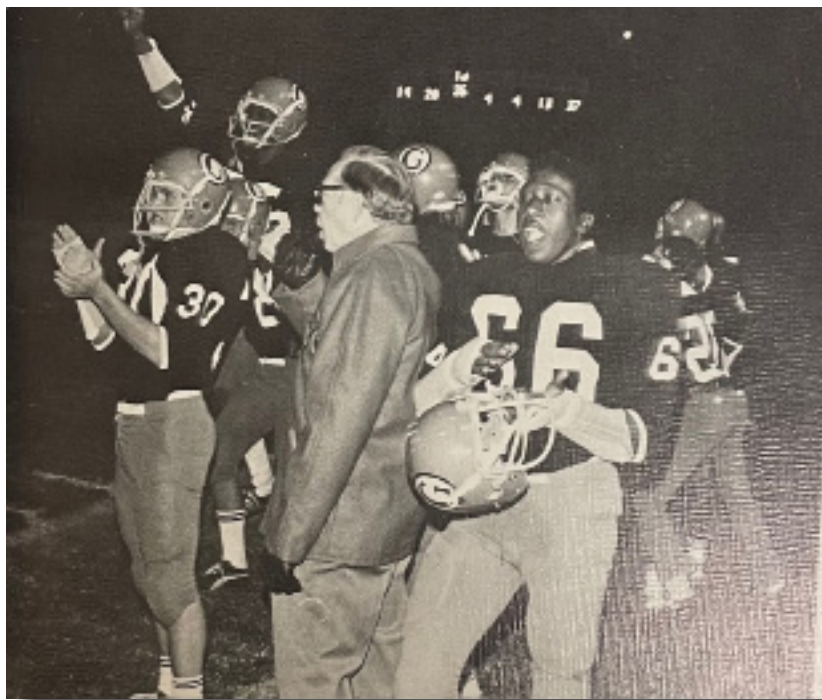


Keeping Tradition Alive
